Holocaust Torah Rededication Shabbat December 9 - 10, 2022

This year marks 25 years since our Holocaust Torah was brought to Beth Emeth, on permanent loan from what is now the Memorial Scrolls Trust of London, England. This scroll, MST#11, was originally from an unknown town in Bohemia or Moravia. It was one of 1564 Torahs confiscated during the Holocaust and put into the Jewish Museum in Prague under

Whenever we experience strong emotion, it can be difficult to find words to express what we are feeling. The book of Psalms contains 150 sacred poems which express the entire range of human emotion. Each session of this six-week course will examine a selection of Psalms which relate to a specific emotion, examining multiple translations and where, applicable, musical settings for the how we can use sacred texts to validate and balance out our feelings.




